At the October meeting Harold George gave an excellent presentation on The Medal of Honor. He told us how the medal was adopted during the Civil War. The members of Andrews raid being the first to receive it.

There were no guide lines governing whom should receive it. So until they had a board of review in 1916 many civilians including Charles Linberg and Wm. Cody were awarded medals. They even gave part of a regiment medals just for reenlisting. At the board of review a criteria was set up for requirements of medal recipiants and many medals were revoked.

### 150 YEARS AGO

November 6 - Jefferson Davis is elected to a six year term as Confederate president.

Nov. 7 - A Union expedition captures Port Royal sound, South Carolina.

Union troops under General Ulysses S. Grant attack a Confederate camp at Belmont, Missouri, but are forced to retreat.

Nov. 8 - Confederate commissioners James M. Mason and John Sidell are seized by the U.S. Navy from the British mail steamer Trent.

Nov. 9 - Major General Henry W. Halleck is placed in command of Union Troops in Missouri, Arkansas, Illinois, and western Kentucky

Gen. Don Carlos Buell replaces William T. Sherman in command of federal troops in Kentucky.

November 30 - Great Britain officially protests the seizure of Mason and Sllidell and demands an apology.
