Custer at Little Big Horn

Russell Booth provided the program at the May meeting. He had an excellent program which shed a new light on the events at the battle of Little Big Horn. Unfortunately his voice was so weak that unless you were sitting at the front of the table most of the audience had a hard time hearing him.

Many history accounts would have us believe that Custer disobeyed orders and led his men into a trap. Russell showed that when the actual events are analysed it is easy to see that Custer did what was logical. Unfortunately his command of about 450 troops ran into an Indian camp of about 7,000 Indians, over 2,000 of them warriors with repeating rifles.

150 YEARS AGO

June 9 - Stonewall Jackson's Shenandoah Valley Campaign comes to an end with the Battle of Port Republic, Virginia. After the Union loss, Lincoln ordered troops to withdraw. Jackson turned his forces to help Lee near Richmond.

June 17 - General Braxton Bragg takes over command of the main Confederate army in Mississippi.

June 25 - The battle of Oak Grove, Virginia, marks the beginning of the Seven Day's Battles, as McClellan continues his attempt to reach Richmond.
