APRIL MEETING

April's meeting will be held on Saturday, April 28 at 9:00. We meet at the Ninth Street Methodist Church.

Our speaker will be Tom Vince. Tom will speak on the subject of "Ohio Enters the War 1861-1862"



Tom Vince has been Archivist and Historian at Western Reserve Academy in Hudson, Ohio since 1996, a boarding school that was founded in 1826 and which has a rich Civil War history of its own. Tom holds degrees from three universities, a certificate from the National Trust for Historic Preservation where he was a Woodlawn fellow, and certificate in Archives management from the Taft School in Watertown, CT. Long active in his community, he has served on several city boards and is a past president of the Hudson Rotary Club, the Heritage Association, and the Cuyahoga Valley Civil War Round Table which has met continuously in Pennsula since 1959, and is one of Ohio's oldest civil War groups.. In 2009 the Hudson Chamber of Commerce named Tom Vince its Citizen of the Year.

Tom's civil war interest began with John Brown when he was Director of the Hudson Library and Historical Society and responsible for acquiring two large John Brown family collections for the library. He joined the Cuyahoga Valley CWRT in 1979 and expanded his interests in Ohio's role in the war. He has organized and led tours to Gettysburg, and has conducted one day tours of the Last Two Days of Morgan's Raid in Ohio, another favorite topic of his.

Our host for the meeting supplying treats to go along with the coffee is John Slovski.

but are unsuccessful in disrupting Confederate rail
communications in Georgia

April 16 - Slavery is abolished in the District of Columbia. Slaveholders are compensated up to \$300 for each emancipated slave.

April 24 - Captain David G. Farragut's Union fleet Successfully engages and passes the Confederate batteries and gunboats guarding New Orleans.
