




MARCH MEETING

150 YEARS AGO

March 8 - The CSS Virginia sinks two Union warships, the USS Cumberland and the USS Congress.

March 9 - Ironclad ships clash in the first such naval engagement when
the USS Monitor and CSS Virginia fight to a draw.

March 11 General George McClelland is removed from his position as Union general in chief.

March 13 - General Henry W. Halleck is named to the command of the Department of the Mississippi.

March 14 - In the Battle of New Bern, Union forces capture North Carolina's second-largest town, New Bern.

March 22 - The CSS Florida, built in the shipyards of Liverpool, England, sets out from that port.

March 23 - Stonewall Jackson loses the Battle of Kernstown in northern Virginia,
but his presence worries leaders in Washington. Instead of accompanying

General McClelland on his Peninsula Campaign, some troops are held
back to protect the capital.

March 26 - Union troops push Confederates back at the Battle of Apache Canyon, New Mexico Territory.

March 29 - General Albert S. Johnston is placed in command of reorganized Confederate

forces at Corinth, Mississipi.
