November 9 - Lincoln sees John Wilkes Booth perform in "The Marble Heart" at Ford's Theater.

Nov. 16 - Burnside successfully retreats into Knoxville, Tenn., after an engagement with Longstreet's troops a Campbell's Station, Tennessee.

Nov. 17 - Longstreet conducts a siege of Knoxville, Tennessee.

November 19 - Lincoln attends the dedication of a national cemetery at Gettysburg, Penn., and delivers his Gettysburg Address.

Nov 23 - The Battle of Chattanooga, Tenn., results in Grant's army pushing Bragg's forces out of the area.

November 27 - John Hunt Morgan and others escape from the Ohio State Penitentiary in Columbus.

November 30 - Braxton Bragg resigns from command of the Army of Tennessee.
