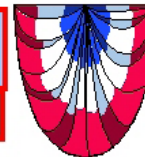

The Host for this meeting, supplying the treats to go along with the coffee is Carl and Vickie Keefer.



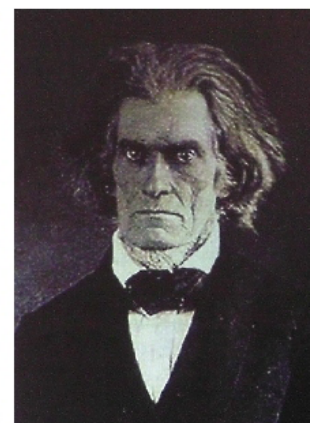
Our speaker for the meeting is WAYNE E. MOTTS. **REALLY, THIS MONTH, WAYNE MOTTS REALLY WILL BE SPEAKING.** Wayne is a native of Groveport, OH. He holds two degrees in history and has been a licensed battlefield guide at the Gettysburg National Military Park for twenty-five years. He was the curator of the Cumberland County Historical Society in Carlisle, Penn. from 2002-2004 and the artifact collections manager at the Adams County Historical in Gettysburg from 2004-2005. In 2003 he was named executive director of the society, a position he held for seven years. He became the CEO of the National Civil War Museum, in Harrisburg, Penn. in the spring of 2012.

Wayne will be using sources from the National Museum to tell us about major Political and Social issues of the Civil War. **YOU DON'T WANT TO MISS THIS ONE.**

AT OUR SEPTEMBER MEETING

Richard Troup presented a very interesting program on "Relics and Reminiscences". He has a very good collection of Civil war artifacts. Many of which he found at garage sales. paying little for them at the time. His greatest purchase was two tree stumps taken from a Civil war battlefield. They were full of canon balls and conical artillery shot as well as minnie balls. He bought two of them for \$100. They now have a value of about \$7,000 apiece and are displayed at the McConnelsville Historical museum.
